

ORDINANCE NO. 126
PACIFIC COUNTY, WASHINGTON
AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE RELATING TO BAN OF OPEN
BURNING DURING 1992 DRY SEASON

WHEREAS, continued dry weather has resulted in extremely dry vegetation and ground cover in Pacific County; and,

WHEREAS, the vegetation is highly combustible at the current time and that open burning of any kind under these conditions would be extremely hazardous; and,

WHEREAS, the County believes that the extremely dry conditions currently in existence render it in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to pass an ordinance now limiting open burning of any kind; now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY OF PACIFIC, STATE OF WASHINGTON HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Due to the extreme fire hazard, open burning of any kind is hereby banned and in effect immediately for the 1992 dry season.

Approved fire pits are excluded from this ban only if they are located 200 feet westward of dune grasses and or in designated areas (i.e. State, County or Private Campgrounds).

This ordinance is declared to be a public emergency ordinance, necessary for the immediate protection of the public health, public safety and public property and as such shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
