

ORDINANCE NO. 54

AN ORDINANCE Adopting Police Regulations for the Health and Safety of the Residents of Pacific County.

WHEREAS RCW 36.32.120 authorizes the Board to Adopt appropriate ordinances for Police Regulations for the Health and Safety of the Residents of Pacific County,

WHEREAS there is currently no requirement that hospitals or institutional homes are required to notify the Pacific County Sheriff's Office of any possibly criminally inflicted injuries or sicknesses, Now Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PACIFIC COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Every person conducting, maintaining or having charge of any hospital or institutional home, on receiving any person at such hospital or institutional home who cannot be identified or who is suffering from poisoning,, administered by himself or by another, or from any bullet wound or knife wound, or from any other physical injury, or traumatism inflicted with probable criminal intent, or who is suffering from an overdose of legal or illegal drugs, or who is suffering from any other type of possible suicide attempt, shall report the same immediately to the Pacific County Sheriff's Office. Any authorized representative of the Pacific County Sheriff's Office may visit such person and seek such information as may appear necessary in determining the cause of poisoning, wound, other injury or drug overdose or suicide attempt. In the event of the death of any such person, the same shall be reported to the Pacific County Sheriff's office immediately following such death.
