RESOLUTION NO. 6

An Ordinance relating to the office of constable and abolishing
the office of constable in Pacific County.

Whereas, after careful study, it is the considered judgment of the
Board of County Commissioners of Pacific County that the office of constable
no longer serves a useful function under modern government and that, in
the interests of public economy and the orderly administration of justice,
the office ought to be abolished;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
PACIFIC COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

That the office of constable in all precincts and districts of Pacific
County be and the same is hereby abolished, and no person shall hereafter
be elected or appointed or serve as constable in any precinct or district
whether such precinct or district be yet established or not: PROVIDED,
this resolution shall not affect the term of office or compensation of any
constable now serving until the end of his present unexpired term.
