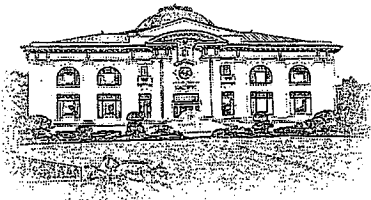

The Pacific County Board of Commissioners would like to offer full support for the Port's grant application for the Recreational Boating Improvement Grant to continue with improvements to the Tokeland Marina which will allow larger recreational boats to access and moor at the marina. As you are aware, we have worked in close partnership over the past several years by providing financial support for marina expansion and improvements.


The Tokeland marina, located at the tip of the Tokepoint peninsula, serves as a hub for both commercial and sports fishery. During peak fishing seasons the marina serves up to 200 boats a day, as well as provides year round moorage for about 22 commercial boats. Maintaining and expanding the marina's capacity is critical to the livelihood of many residents in the Tokeland area, as well as serving as a major draw for tourists to the area. Improvements to the marina to accommodate more, as well as larger recreational boats will offer an option to those boat owners to visit our area to sports fish, crab, or simply spend time enjoying the beautiful Willapa Bay.

Expansion and revitalization of the Tokeland marina for recreational boating has been identified as a priority by the Pacific County Council of Governments (PCOG) and the Board of County Commissioners. The PCOG recently listed the Tokeland Marina Expansion Project as its top priority, and the Board of County Commissioners has approved \$75,000 from the county's Public Facilities Fund to support the expansion project.

The Board applauds the Port's efforts to improve and expand the recreational boating facilities serving Willapa Bay, one of our County's most important resources. Any effort that protects or enhances our natural resources, as well as creates expansion of recreational opportunities in our area is a win-win for us all.

Willapa National Wildlife Refuge request's Pacific County to sponsor two Federal Highway - Federal Land Access Program Grants for projects that will provide enhanced public access and quality public use activities within Pacific County on the Willapa National Wildlife Refuge (Refuge). The Refuge staff would provide technical assistance to complete the application process for the projects. The completed applications will need to be signed by the County.

The goal of the first project, part of the "Connecting Community to Nature" program, would be development of a 1.0 mile Americans with Disabilities Act accessible trail on the South Bay area of the Refuge. This trail would begin on 95th Street in Long Beach and culminate with views of 500 acres of newly restored estuary.

The second grant project proposal would be for replacement of the failing Dohman Creek culvert and repair of 67th Place road from the culvert to the Refuge boundary.



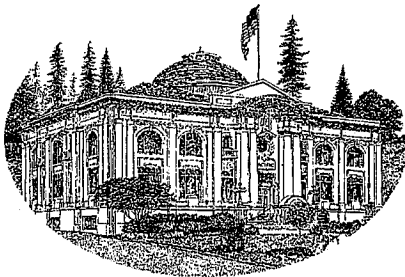

WHEREAS, Pacific County considers it in the best public interest to complete the project described in the application(s);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The 14-1086 South Willapa Bay Access Project Manager for the Friends of the Willapa National Wildlife Refuge (FWNWR) is authorized to make formal application to the Recreation and Conservation Office for grant assistance;

5. Pacific County and FWNWR acknowledges that any facility developed and/or property restored through grant assistance from the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board must be reasonably maintained and made available to the general public unless other restrictions have been agreed to by the Recreation and Conservation Office Director or the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board.

Pacific County and FWNWR acknowledges that any facility developed and/or property restored with grant assistance from the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board must be dedicated for public purposes and be retained and maintained for perpetuity otherwise provided and agreed to by our organization and the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board.




1. The Bear River Trail Project Manager for the FWNWR is authorized to make formal application to the Recreation and Conservation office for grant assistance;





RCW 42.30.110
Executive sessions.

(1) Nothing contained in this chapter may be construed to prevent a governing body from holding an executive session during a regular or special meeting:

- (a) To consider matters affecting national security;
- (b) To consider the selection of a site or the acquisition of real estate by lease or purchase when public knowledge regarding such consideration would cause a likelihood of increased price;
- (c) To consider the minimum price at which real estate will be offered for sale or lease when public knowledge regarding such consideration would cause a likelihood of decreased price. However, final action selling or leasing public property shall be taken in a meeting open to the public;
- (d) To review negotiations on the performance of publicly bid contracts when public knowledge regarding such consideration would cause a likelihood of increased costs;
- (e) To consider, in the case of an export trading company, financial and commercial information supplied by private persons to the export trading company;
- (f) To receive and evaluate complaints or charges brought against a public officer or employee. However, upon the request of such officer or employee, a public hearing or a meeting open to the public shall be conducted upon such complaint or charge;
- (g) To evaluate the qualifications of an applicant for public employment or to review the performance of a public employee. However, subject to RCW [42.30.140\(4\)](#), discussion by a governing body of salaries, wages, and other conditions of employment to be generally applied within the agency shall occur in a meeting open to the public, and when a governing body elects to take final action hiring, setting the salary of an individual employee or class of employees, or discharging or disciplining an employee, that action shall be taken in a meeting open to the public;
- (h) To evaluate the qualifications of a candidate for appointment to elective office. However, any interview of such candidate and final action appointing a candidate to elective office shall be in a meeting open to the public;
- (i) To discuss with legal counsel representing the agency matters relating to agency enforcement actions, or to discuss with legal counsel representing the agency litigation or potential litigation to which the agency, the governing body, or a member acting in an official capacity is, or is likely to become, a party, when public knowledge regarding the discussion is likely to result in an adverse legal or financial consequence to the agency.

This subsection (1)(i) does not permit a governing body to hold an executive session solely because an attorney representing the agency is present. For purposes of this subsection (1)(i), "potential litigation" means matters protected by RPC 1.6 or RCW [5.60.060\(2\)\(a\)](#) concerning:

- (i) Litigation that has been specifically threatened to which the agency, the governing body, or a member acting in an official capacity is, or is likely to become, a party;

(ii) Litigation that the agency reasonably believes may be commenced by or against the agency, the governing body, or a member acting in an official capacity; or

(iii) Litigation or legal risks of a proposed action or current practice that the agency has identified when public discussion of the litigation or legal risks is likely to result in an adverse legal or financial consequence to the agency;

(j) To consider, in the case of the state library commission or its advisory bodies, western library network prices, products, equipment, and services, when such discussion would be likely to adversely affect the network's ability to conduct business in a competitive economic climate. However, final action on these matters shall be taken in a meeting open to the public;

(k) To consider, in the case of the state investment board, financial and commercial information when the information relates to the investment of public trust or retirement funds and when public knowledge regarding the discussion would result in loss to such funds or in private loss to the providers of this information;

(l) To consider proprietary or confidential nonpublished information related to the development, acquisition, or implementation of state purchased health care services as provided in RCW [41.05.026](#);

(m) To consider in the case of the life sciences discovery fund authority, the substance of grant applications and grant awards when public knowledge regarding the discussion would reasonably be expected to result in private loss to the providers of this information;

(n) To consider in the case of a health sciences and services authority, the substance of grant applications and grant awards when public knowledge regarding the discussion would reasonably be expected to result in private loss to the providers of this information;

(o) To consider in the case of innovate Washington, the substance of grant or loan applications and grant or loan awards if public knowledge regarding the discussion would reasonably be expected to result in private loss to the providers of this information.

(2) Before convening in executive session, the presiding officer of a governing body shall publicly announce the purpose for excluding the public from the meeting place, and the time when the executive session will be concluded. The executive session may be extended to a stated later time by announcement of the presiding officer.
